Classroom Instructional Design

Dear PEC Families,

Spring has sprung! We understand that this school year has been unprecedented in design due to the international health pandemic. Although many unknowns remain for both the rest of this school year and for next September, our program planning is already underway. The Primary Education Center Staff believe that parental involvement in a child's educational program is an essential cornerstone for a successful school year. We also recognize that each child has a unique learning style. To nurture your child's strengths, we will continue to create a dynamic instructional design at each grade level. The following education programs <u>may</u> be implemented at the Primary Education Center next school year:

<u>Traditional Elementary Classroom</u>: Students remain with the same academic teacher for the entire instructional day.

<u>Departmentalizing Model</u>: Students transition to another class for one subject. Teacher specialize in a curriculum area like math and writing.

<u>Co-Teaching Model</u>: Students are in one classroom and are instructed by two teachers for part of the day.

Looping: This is an educational design or structure in which a whole class stays together for two consecutive years with the same teacher.

*Combined Looping and Departmentalizing is also sometimes an option.

<u>Multiage Model</u>: This Educational design is composed of students of mixed ages. Most of the children spend two to three years with the same home-based teacher. This model incorporates the concept of looping, departmentalizing, and peer mentoring.



Brad Rowles - Board Report - Written Report - April 26, 2021

Activities that have or will be occurring at the High School:

- Letters were mailed to each 6-12 household explaining our end of the year grading policy and numerous options available to students scheduled to sit for a Regents Exam.
- On Friday, April 23rd, grades closed for the 3rd Quarter. The High School received updated guidance from New York State Department of Education regarding the June 2021 Regents Examination window. Plans are being discussed and implemented at the building level.
- Mr. Casseri and I had a very productive meeting with Artpark to discuss our 70th commencement ceremony which will take place on Friday, June 25th. A rain date of Sunday, June 27th was selected.
- With the latest guidance from the New York State Department of Health, Prom will be held on Friday, June 18th at the Wurlitzer in North Tonawanda. The Prom will be held outdoors at this location to meet the State's restrictions for large gatherings.

A few items to report to the Board of Education and Superintendent *Principal's Activities:*

- Making sure that I am visible throughout the school day.
 - o Greeting the students each morning as they disembark from the buses.
 - Providing expectations and support to our students through morning and afternoon announcements.
 - Being a presence in the cafeteria during each of our 3 lunch periods.
 - Walking the building throughout the day.
- Fostering a strong working relationship with my staff.
- Meeting with my Student Support Team (Green Team) every Wednesday during 8th period.
 - o This group meets weekly during the 2020-2021 school year to discuss student-related concerns.
- Working to maintain a socially distanced building and classrooms through our social distancing guidelines and a classroom utilization chart.
- Meeting monthly with Dr. Lyon and our APEX Liaisons to provide support and guidance with our 100% remote program.
- Working with our amazing custodial staff to maintain a sanitized and safe learning environment for all members of the Lew-Port Family.
- Working with Dr. Grupka on an ongoing and regular basis to address COVID-related issues and concerns at the High School.
- Continue to complete my assigned informal and formal observations for the 2020-2021 school year.
- Met with Dr. Lyon on Thursday, April 1st, for our monthly mentoring session.
- On Friday, March 12th, I met with Dr. Lyon and Mrs. DiVincenzo to continue our work implementing the LinkCrew program for the 2021-2022 school year. This program will be vital to easing the difficult transition that many of our Freshmen experience each year.
- The Lancer Learning Center Committee met on Tuesday, March 16th and Monday, April 19th to develop the program's guidelines and expectations. Our next meeting will be on Monday, May 10th.
- The next meeting with Dr. Lyon and our Attendance Alignment Committee will be Thursday, April 29th.
- Met with the Strategic Planning Sub-Committee on Climate and Culture on Wednesday, April 21st.
- I have begun to meet with my Peer Coordinators to discuss scheduling for the 2021-2022 school year.
- As of 2/4/2021, I have completed all of my Formal Observations for the 2020-2021 school year.

Principal's Message:

As we begin the final 10 weeks of the school year, our thoughts and goals turn towards the successful completion of this difficult and unprecedented year. Upon our return from break, I shared two letters with High School Families that articulated our end of the year grading policy and the numerous options available to students who are currently scheduled to sit for any one of the Four Regents Exams being offered by New York

State. The grading policy that was adopted by both the Middle School and High School, will allow for an accurate determination of students' success, while also providing valuable data points and indicators of academic growth for next school year. The grading policy will allow a student to earn course credit by achieving a 65% or better during the 4 quarters, a 65% or better on a Local final Exam, or achieving a 65% on a Regents Exam. By providing numerous options, we are providing a flexible grading policy that allows our students to adequately demonstrate academic proficiency, while not eliminating the possibility to earn course credit for the 2020-2021 school year.
