

What is MIOSM®? PILLAR 1 - TEACHING AND LEARNING

 Every spring, the Grades 3-8 English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics Tests are administered to students across New York State. Over the past two years, the NY State Education Department has made several changes to the annual Grades 3-8 English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics Tests in response to concerns from parents and educators.

The New York State English Language Arts and Math Testing schedule for the Primary Education Center, Intermediate Education Center and the Middle School will be as follows:

ELA - Grades 3 through 8

- March 25, 26 (Two days of ELA testing)
- Make up testing for the ELA will begin on March 30 through April 1

Math - Grades 3 through 8

- April 22, 23 (Two days of Math testing)
- Make up for the Math will begin on April 24 through the 28
- As you know, we place great value in ALL ongoing assessments of students' reading and
 written responses, as well as on students' contributions to classroom discussions and
 project based work in all subject areas. We want each student to have the opportunity to
 do his/her best and we recognize that teachers in each class have prepared their students
 to perform at a high level on both the standardized ELA and Math tests. Families play
 such an important role in this process. Here are some reminders of the kinds of things
 that you can do to help children feel comfortable on testing days.
- Make sure your child gets plenty of rest and a breakfast that will carry him or her through the school day.
- Please make sure that students arrive on time in their classroom and are ready to work on test days. We will begin testing immediately at the start of the school day in each school.
- Please make sure your child arrives at school on time and is ready to do their best.
- BE POSITIVE! Positive words are always helpful in any situation and students work hard and deserve our praise.

As always, we appreciate your support and look forward to 100% participation.

SAVE THE DATE! On Friday, March 20 there will be No Students in attendance due to a
Parent/Teacher Conference Day. Please contact the guidance office or individual teachers
to schedule a conference. If you are not able to make it, but would like to schedule a

conference at a different time, please contact the Guidance office at bvandeusen@lew-port.com or (716) 286-7208.

- The 25 week marking period came to a close on February 28 and the 30 week mark (3rd Quarter) will close on April 3, this is a reminder that grades and attendance can be accessed through the Powerschool Parent Portal at any time. A link to the portal can be accessed from our District web-page at www.lew-port.com. Report cards can also be accessed by using your parent created Powerschool account. Report cards are electronic and are NOT printed (unless requested from guidance) or sent via mail. If you need assistance in setting up this account or have questions regarding access, please contact the Guidance office at bvandeusen@lew-port.com or (716) 286-7208.
- After School Assistance Program is continuing for those students that had two or more failing marks for the second Quarter (25 week mark) and we will adjust groups based upon the 30 week mark (3rd Quarter) when it closes. ASAP is also open to ALL students who need extra help or who continue to struggle. As a reminder, each grade level has a designated day each week for ASAP:

Monday - Grade 8
Wednesday - Grade 6
Thursday - Grade 7

- Don't forget to accept invitations you receive via email to join Google Classroom! If you
 have a registered email address with Lewiston Porter, you should have received an
 automated invitation email to join Google Classroom. Please accept this invitation so
 your email address can be populated with your child's Google Classroom account. This
 will allow you to receive notifications from your student's teachers. This also will allow
 you to receive important information regarding One District, One Book as well.
- If you are not connected to your child's Google Classroom already, and you did not get an
 automated invitation, please contact the middle school guidance office at
 bvandeusen@lew-port.com or (716) 286-7208. We will need to obtain your current email
 information so you can be registered to Google Classroom. Thank you and we look

This Innovative learning process is being incorporated in many of our 8th grade classrooms and includes students engaging in the skill of working in collaborative teams who explore a given topic through an active creative process which is continuously opened and edited, expanded and defined on its journey from idea to the public sharing of story. Throughout this innovative process students are able to demonstrate and articulate the vocabulary necessary to define ideas based on the needs of a story and its intended audience (Conflict Resolution). They are able to demonstrate a foundational ability to collaboratively use story-based learning in the classroom community. Our entire 8th grade took a field trip to Buffalo State college to experience a performance put on by students from the college called "Trash".
 Following the play, our students had the opportunity to participate in a hands-on workshop rooted in Story-Based Learning presented through he Anne Frank Project.
