





# Pillar 1 - Teaching and Learning

- What a difference one month makes! In the March edition we were talking about what was happening in classrooms and throughout the building. A month later and I am trying to come up with a description for how distance learning is occuring. A one word answer......Different! Alan and I have been meeting with the Peer Coordinators on a weekly basis to get a sense on how this different way of teaching and learning is occuring. Overall, I feel we are making it work. Expectations are different when students are not with you daily and each grade level and each teacher is finding ways to provide a "continuity of learning" plan that is both beneficial and not overwhelming to families.
- Multiple teachers are using many digital formats like Zoom and Google Meet/Hangout to work with kids face to face and keep those social/emotional connections with kids that we know are so important during this distance learning time.
- We have had a lot of discussion regarding face to face meetings via video chat. The expectation that has been clarified to our teachers is to make connections with students and to make sure that they are doing ok and see if they need help with any work or if we can help them in some way with technology. That could and will look different based upon each student and a phone call to connect with students is appropriate as well.
- There is no expectation for the amount of times that teachers connect with students, just that they are reaching out in some way and to identify that we are here for them and to see if they need any help. A Zoom or Google meeting can boost the social/emotional component that is so needed right now, but not expected or required. It is more about making sure kids are doing okay and letting them know we are still here for them rather than as an educational value. I think it helps them to hear our voice! It works really well for educational purposes too!
- Teachers are aware that as we move into Quarter 4, one lesson per week is certainly acceptable. The plan might look different at each grade level and for each subject but an example in 6th grade might look like this:

Math

Monday-watch the video

Tuesday/Wednesday- work through examples using the video if necessary

-touch base with the teacher with questions

Thursday/Friday- short assignment to assess learning (2-4 questions)

- If individual teachers want to do more or have more regular video chat meetings, that is fine too. I think it looks different for each student based upon factors that may be happening in the home. We do not want to overwhelm parents but we also want to make sure that we can keep the educational gaps to a minimum as much as possible.
- The big reminder to teachers is to make sure kids are okay and to collect what we can from assignments completed so we can give credit. We do not want to penalize a student for not doing it or turning it in, realizing that there are many different reasons for that being the case in each household.
- An email to parents describing the process that we will use to close out the 30 week marking period (Quarter 3), was sent out on April 15. In summary, the process will be as follows:
  - 30 week marking period (3rd Quarter) will close on April 30.
  - Any student assignments, including work up to March 13th, will be included for the 3rd quarter grade.
  - The final grade for all students during the 3rd quarter will be identified in the Parent Portal as either PASS or INCOMPLETE. Parents will be able to see this designation in the Parent Portal in conjunction with the percentage that a student has earned, along with any teacher comments.
  - If a student receives an incomplete for the 3rd quarter, students will be contacted to let them know what assignments they still owe and what assignments need to be turned in for third quarter credit. <u>This work</u> <u>WILL NOT translate into a percentage grade, but could be used as credit for changing an INCOMPLETE to a PASS.</u>

- Students will be given the opportunity to make up assignments that were missing prior to March 13th AND/OR, at the teacher discretion, use other identified work that was submitted during the Home Learning Transition Period to qualify for a grade of PASS. Students with an INCOMPLETE will have an opportunity to make up Quarter 3 assignments during Quarter 4 to turn the Incomplete into a PASS.
- Collected assignments from ALL classes will be required for credit that will be recorded in PowerSchool and can be viewed in the Parent Portal. Report card grades will be available through the Parent Portal starting on May 8.

# • Home Learning Transition Period (March 14 - April 30, 2020) -

 All Home Learning Opportunities that were provided between March 14, 2020 - April 30, 2020 will be marked in Powerschool and Google classroom as either "collected" or "missing." Items collected from this time period will NOT be graded, BUT <u>may be</u> used for credit toward a 3rd Marking Period passing grade, if necessary.

# • For the 4th quarter the following will apply: 4th Quarter (May 1, 2020 forward) -

- ALL teachers will begin providing new assignments and materials on *May 1, 2020*.
- Teachers will prepare and assign student work for ALL classes and students will continue to access assignments and materials through current Google Classroom codes. Teachers will continue to communicate with students via student email or other means, as appropriate.
- New 4th quarter Exploratory classes (ie Family and Consumer Sciences (FACS), art, and computer technology) will proceed on May 1. Students will be assigned to 4th quarter exploratory classes and teachers will be sending Google Classroom codes for these classes to each student via student email. Assignments and materials for these new classes can be accessed through Google Classroom. PLEASE make sure to have students accept the Google Classroom invitations for these new classes in their email account.
- Collected assignments from ALL classes will be required for a grade/credit that will be recorded in PowerSchool and can be viewed in the Parent Portal.
- It is anticipated that grades for <u>Quarter 4</u> will also be identified as a PASS or an INCOMPLETE based upon the assignments submitted and the quality of the submitted assignments for the quarter.
- Grades and progress reports can be accessed through the Powerschool Parent Portal at any time. A link to the portal can be accessed from our District webpage at <a href="https://www.lew-port.com">www.lew-port.com</a>.

This will allow parents to receive notifications from individual teachers and allows them to receive important information regarding assignments due as well as materials needed during this period of digital instruction.
