

STEAM instruction will now be year round for our students in first through third grade twice in a six day rotation. K-5 Primary students were rotated through reading, writing and math lessons in a departmentalizing model offering students opportunities for movement and specialization in each core discipline. Every primary student left camp with a portfolio of their work. Our intermediate level students worked on interdisciplinary projects together. The teachers have weaved in the rainforest and animal research projects into ELA and part of the math instruction.
