Pillar 1 - Teaching and Learning

- We closed grades for assignments and projects on June 9. Grades will be finalized and made available for parents to view on Powerschool starting on June 15. This will give students an opportunity to submit any assignments that are needed for credit. As you know, we are not providing a numerical grade for Quarter 4 but rather students will see a P(pass) or INC(incomplete). The big reminder to teachers is to collect what we can from assignments completed so we can give credit. We do not want to penalize a student for not doing it or turning it in, realizing that there are many different reasons for that being the case in each household.
- The year end grade will be calculated using the following weighting scale:
 - Q1=40%,
 - Q2=40%,
 - Q3=20%
 - Q4=P or INC
 - Q1-Q3 Averaged for a Y1 numeric grade Any student with a year end average below a 65 will be marked as a P and numeric grade will be changed to a *65 with a comment about missing or work not completed. All students will pass.
- As you may recall, each grade level developed a project to start Q4 new learning. We are calling it the "Time Capsule Project". We felt that it is really important to have students capture this moment that we are going through to become "primary sources" of information about their experiences during this time. Each subject/grade level assigned students criteria for digitally capturing these experiences so that they can be shared with future generations. Here is the 8th grade team introducing the project to the students. 8th Grade Time Capsule.
 - The project has now been completed and teachers have selected some of the most original and best student work to include into a digital document that we will be sharing with students/families via Google classroom. We anticipate that some of these will be shared via social media after June 12. Check your Twitter!
- We had our Student Drop off/Pick up on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>June 10 Students with last names A-L 12:30 6pm</u> and <u>Thursday</u>, <u>June 11 Students with last names M-Z 12:30 6pm</u>. Students were asked to return items such as Chromebook/Chromebook Charger, Textbooks, Library books along with any other items belonging to the school and assigned to students (calculators,etc.).
- Once these two days of pickups are complete, we will make a plan for collection of any items not returned or picked up so that all can be accounted for.


