




Safari Summer Learning Camp

164 students registered for our elementary summer camp program K-5 (See breakdown of grades, below). Primary students are rotating through reading, writing and math lessons in a departmentalizing model offering students opportunities for movement and specialization in each core discipline. Our intermediate level students are working on interdisciplinary projects together. The teachers have weaved in the rainforest and animal projects

into ELA and part of the math instruction. The teachers are utilizing a book series that they will incorporate as a read aloud for close reading strategies. Interactive notebooks and writing journals are used daily. A Junior Counselor component has also been incorporated to support middle and high school students who are interested in education. The middle and highschool counselors helped to recruit students. They are wonderful role models for our younger students and begin each day with positive morning announcements. A Family Handbook for K-5 Summer Camp was created and is posted on the PEC website.

Past Events

- 8th Grade Moving up Celebration Parade and activity day on June 21 was a great success! Students were greeted by the 8th grade faculty and their classmates on their final day at the Middle School and parents were able to help us celebrate as we sent the Class of 2025 off to the High School. Our 8th grade team put together a memorable experience for our students who had a very unusual year and a half as we navigated the pandemic disruption. The remainder of the day included a light breakfast, viewing of the 8th grade slideshow, a pizza lunch (Huge thank you to Favorite's Pizza in Lewiston for donating ALL the pizza!), and a day full of outdoor activities and events (made possible by the generation donation from the PTSA).
- Just a reminder that grade reports will NOT be sent home. Each parent letter up to this point has
 contained information reminding parents that they will now need to access grades and report cards from
 the Parent Portal. Grades can be accessed in real time and anyone that needs assistance setting up an
 account is encouraged to contact the guidance office. If there is any parent that would like a printed report
 card, they just need to contact the guidance office and we will send them one.
- Final grades have been posted and we have communicated with families of those who are being recommended for Summer learning Camp or Summer School this year. The focus of the Summer camp will be to help mitigate learning gaps that may have formed or widened as a result of the pandemic. The focus is primarily ELA and Math.
- Due to some outstanding work by Mrs. Stack and Ms. Wright, our counselors who personally reached out
 to parents/guardians, we have 36 students that signed up for the Summer learning camp and are
 participating. We also have 17 students who have been recommended for summer school and are
 attending to work on gaining course credit in the subjects that they did not pass. We worked closely with
 the parents well before final exams to make sure they were not "surprised" by the final results.
- Mr. Penale and Mrs. Golden have come up with some innovative activities to assist our students in mitigating the gaps using some really cool stuff. The camp is being offered Monday-Thursday from 9AM-12PM starting on July 6th through July 22nd. Transportation is available if required by families and the focus is on supporting strategic learning in the areas of reading, writing and math.
- Prior to school ending, we pushed into NEST groups to recruit students for participation in the 8th Grade Innovation Experience. Letters with an application process were given out to students and we are currently working through the next steps in the process for those students who are interested in participating. We are looking at some scheduling options to keep this valuable experience moving forward in a proactive way.

Future Events

- We made some minor changes to the Master schedule in regards to the number of sections at each grade level and it is coming along nicely. Alan is working with Beverly prior to her leaving due to retirement on July 30, to get as much student info into the system as possible so that we can begin to run loads.
 - Global Language will continue to be offered every day in 7th and 8th grades. Students are scheduled based upon the choice of language that they made via a google form in April/May.
