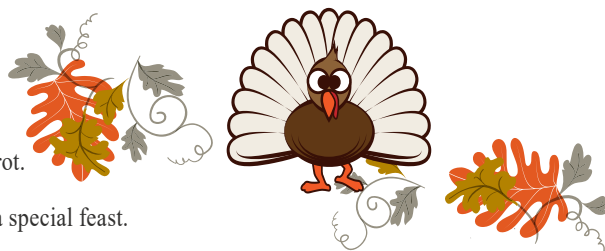

After the trot, students went back inside to perform songs for their families and took part in a special feast.



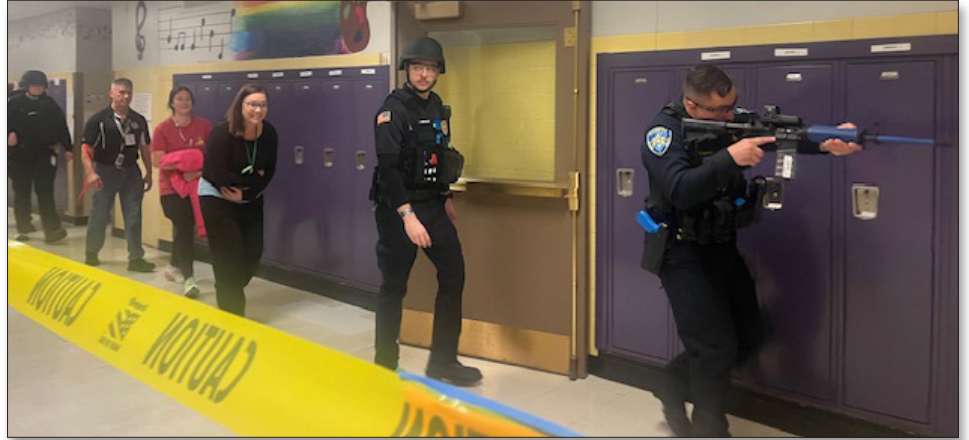

This training is important to remind staff how to respond in a critical situation.

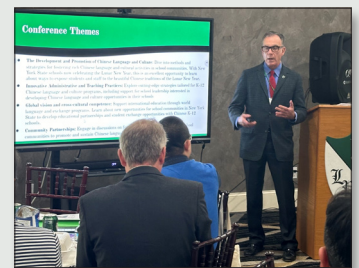


Chinese Language Conference Promotes Cultural Literacy

The 3rd Annual Chinese Language Education and Administration Development Conference for New York K-12 Schools held at Niagara Crossing Hotel and Spa in Lewiston, October 11 -12, 2024, was sponsored and hosted by the Center for Bridging Cultures and Lewiston-Porter Central School District. Mr. Casseri states in his welcome letter to the attendees, "The event highlights the commitment of Lewiston-Porter Central Schools and the Center for Bridging Cultures to expanding global perspectives and promoting cultural literacy. This conference underscores the growing need for language education as a pathway to mutual respect and shared global citizenship."

The conference consisted of various speakers presenting on such topics as; The Development and Promotion of Chinese Language and Culture, Innovative Administrative and Teaching Practices, and Global vision and cross-cultural competence, just to name a few. Our presenters were educators, students and business executives and included, Candace Black from New York State Education Department, and Angelina Olivera, a sophomore at Alfred University and graduate of Lewiston-Porter Class of 2023.

After participating in several afternoon presentations and group discussions, the conference attendees enjoyed a dinner in the evening followed by cultural performances including a Tai Chi demonstration, a traditional Chinese Dance performed by Lewiston-Porter elementary students of visiting Chinese Teacher, Ms. Shuping Song, a song performed by a group of Lewiston-Porter High School Chinese Language students, as well as a beautiful Guzheng duet performed by the Artistic Director of Alfred University Guzheng Ensemble and her student, Max Rasilla.

Principal Tina Rodriguez says, "We are honored to have received this designation. We have seen amazing results from implementing this model at our school, such as students finding their voice, decrease in discipline issues, attendance and academic results. We can point to one example of a shy third grader who is now on the Lancer Leadership Team and leading our school assemblies as the MC with her beautiful voice. We are so proud of her confidence and success since implementing this program."

FranklinCovey's Leader in Me is an evidence-based PK-12 model, developed in partnership with educators, designed to build resilience and leadership in students, create a high-trust culture, and help improve academic achievement. It helps students, their families and educators with leadership and life skills needed to thrive, adapt and contribute in a dynamic world. The Lighthouse certification is a highly regarded standard and given to schools who have experienced significant measurable results and having an extraordinary impact on staff, students, parents and the greater community.

The school has been modeling the Leader in Me education teachings to achieve the district's common goal of preparing students with college, career and life readiness skills. They have found students are becoming more self-aware, independent, take initiative, plan ahead, set and track goals, do their homework, prioritize their time, be considerate of others, communicate effectively, resolve conflicts, find creative solutions, value differences, live a balanced life and contribute to society.

Lew-Port Students Experience Once In a Lifetime Trip



Lewiston-Porter Central School District Spanish teacher Eileen Lapp Hastings took a group of students to Ecuador and the Galápagos Islands towards the end of the school year. "The destination was chosen because I wanted our students to have an opportunity to absorb the Hispanic culture and language in an area that is so scientifically significant in our world," she says.

The Galápagos Islands are a chain of volcanic islands in the Eastern Pacific. They are famous for various species that were studied by Charles Darwin in the 1830's and inspired his theory of evolution by means of natural selection. Students grades 8-12 were invited to partake in the trip. "All students revealed numerous times what an amazing, life changing experience the journey was," says Lapp Hastings. "They were thrilled with how much they learned, while having fun!"

During their tour the group visited the equatorial line in Ecuador, known as the "Middle of the World". While there they conducted scientific experiments, which are designed to test the unique physical forces at work in the region. They then traveled to the Galapagos islands where they were surrounded by unique plant and animal life only found on these islands.
