- November 15, 2023 What an exciting day for our school and District! By now you are aware that we had
 a visit from New York State Education Commissioner Dr. Betty A. Rosa who helped us to surprise Mrs.
 Kim Alexander Carlo, the first educator in Lewiston-Porter Central School District history to receive the
 prestigious national Milken Educator Award! We were joined by Milken Educator Awards Senior Program
 Director Greg Gallagher along with Dr. Rosa who presented Kim with the honor before our cheering
 students, colleagues, dignitaries, and media.
- The Award recognizes outstanding K-12 educators nationwide for their excellence and leadership in the profession and provides recipients with an unrestricted \$25,000 cash prize to match the significance of their job. Kim is the sole New York Milken Educator Award recipient this season and is one of up to 75 recipients across the country who will be honored in 2023-24.

This event is a culmination of their creativity, compassion, and dedication to making a positive impact in the lives of those in need, especially during the Thanksgiving season.
 - In addition to the sandwich-making activity, students will be participating in various activities and simulations designed to provide them with a deeper understanding of hunger, food scarcity, and the unequal distribution of resources. These activities aim to foster empathy and a sense of responsibility toward addressing these critical issues in our community.

- On November 17, nineteen of our students participated in a field trip to the Rochester Riverside Convention Center for a day filled with hands-on activities, engaging demos, wonder, and excitement centered around S.T.E.A.M. and every aspect of the Maker Movement. The day was dedicated to students in 3rd through 8th-grade school groups from around the area.
- Builders Club is sponsoring a Food Drive from November 1-17. We will be collecting non-perishable food items such as cereal, canned meat or fish, stews, soups, canned fruit and vegetables, rice, pasta, noodles, pasta sauce, box dinners, paper products, and personal care items. Donations can be dropped off at the Cafeteria in the Middle School or the Main Entrance of the High School, IEC, PEC. This is a great learning opportunity for our students to help feed the hungry in Lewiston, Youngstown, Ransomville,

and Sanborn by donating cans/boxes of food. All food items will be donated to Ransomville Care-n-Share Food Pantry and given to people right in our communities!
